Cardiovascular Pharmacotherapy: A Focus on Differences between Women and Men

Management of cardiovascular diseases is complex, and the evidence supports significant mortality reductions based on numerous trials that may not represent the population equally. Sex-related differences in the prevalence, presentation, management, and outcomes of this disease for women have been evaluated over the past two decades and significant differences may influence a change in care. During this continuing education program, the participants will get an overview of the current management of hypertension, hyperlipidemia, heart failure, and acute coronary syndromes. An interactive approach will be utilized to apply the information available on sex differences and the implications of these findings on treatment management in cardiovascular diseases.

Objectives

1. Describe treatment advancements in common cardiovascular diseases since the release of important clinical treatment guidelines (e.g., JNC 7, ATP III).
2. Explain the following with regard to new cardiovascular pharmacotherapeutic agents: name, dose(s), indication(s), contraindications, mechanism of action, drug interventions, adverse effects, and monitoring parameters.
3. Describe differences between women and men including but not limited to incidence/prevalence of common cardiovascular diseases, risk factors for these diseases and treatment effectiveness.
