- Joshua C. Baker, O.D., M.S., is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Midwestern University.

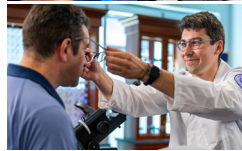
Midwestern University Local Impact



Local Impact: Midwestern University is home to Arizona's largest medical school and the state's first veterinary college. As of September 2025, over 18,000 healthcare professionals have graduated from all of Midwestern's programs, with 42% remaining in Arizona to practice, helping to address critical shortages statewide.



Economic Impact: According to a survey by Applied Economics, the University has an economic impact of \$767 million in Maricopa County and has created nearly 1000 campus-based jobs.



Community Service: Midwestern University faculty and students are actively engaged in community service through University-sponsored events, alliances with healthcare organizations such as the American Diabetes Association, and work study programs. Midwestern students and employees provide over 10,000 hours of community service annually through outreach programs, health screenings, and education throughout the state.

Midwestern University Multispecialty Clinic (Opened 2007)

- Family Medicine, Foot and Ankle Services, Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine, Pharmacy Services
- Licensed healthcare providers and/or students provide care with faculty supervision

Midwestern University Dental Institute (Opened June 2010)

- Comprehensive family dentistry, including advanced imaging, oral surgery, pediatric dentistry, orthodontics, laser treatments, dentures/partial dentures and same-day crowns
- Third- and fourth-year CDMA students provide care with faculty supervision

Midwestern University Eye Institute (Opened October 2010)

- Comprehensive family eye and vision care, including eye exams, glasses and contact lenses, disease screenings, pediatric care, ocular prosthetics, and ophthalmology
- Third- and fourth-year AZCOPT students provide care with faculty supervision

Midwestern University Animal Health Institute (Opened December 2014)

- Companion Animal Clinic: comprehensive small animal care, including urgent care, internal medicine, diagnostic imaging, surgery, dentistry, wellness, senior pet care, canine physical rehabilitation, neurology, and dialysis
- Large Animal Clinic: large animal medicine and training
- Diagnostic Pathology Center: necropsy and pathology services and training
- Midwestern University Zoological Medical Institute at the Phoenix Zoo: partnership involving CVM students and faculty for exotic/zoo animal health
- Third- and fourth-year CVM students provide care with faculty supervision

Midwestern University Therapy Institute (Opened December 2019)

- Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Clinical Psychology, Low Vision Rehabilitation, Sports Vision Performance Training, Vision Therapy, Speech-Language Pathology
